### **BAPTIST HUI**

Once a year, representatives from each of the 240 Baptist churches in New Zealand meet together in one place to worship, pray, korero/discuss, make key decisions and fellowship together.

The annual national Baptist Hui is usually held in the first week of November and runs for three days and two nights. All Baptist churches are encouraged to attend our annual Hui by sending delegates from the membership, not just pastoral staff. There are seven great reasons why this is the case:

- 1. We represent our local church in wider discussion and decision making.
- 2. We engage with and get to know our national team including the national leader, office team and other national ministry leaders.
- 3. We get to know the focus and direction of a range of ministry areas including the New Zealand Baptist Missionary Society and Carey Baptist College.
- 4. We meet other church leadership and members.
- 5. We celebrate together key achievements and moments.
- 6. We gain a feel for the direction of the Baptist Churches of New Zealand.
- 7. It's the one time in the year when we get to be with others from the broader movement and learn from them.

### **REGIONAL HUI**

The Otago & Southland Baptist Association churches and leaders usually gather together twice a year; one of these being a residential hui/retreat and the other is the Annual General Meeting/hui. These are designed to consider how the national vision can be integrated and contextualised as well as develop specific vision for the region.

- 1. The residential regional annual hui is usually held in the first half of the year.
  - Three days and two nights at a central venue.
  - A local flavour mix of spiritual reflection, inspiration, envisioning, leadership development and discussion and decision on key matters for the region.
- The one day gathering and AGM is held in September/October to action the business of the Association and to further relationship, discussion and decisions that impact the region.

Both these events enable the wider region to work together, to encourage and support each other and to strengthen the region as a whole for the sake of Christ. They also help us to connect and build relationship which opens the door for seeking advice and sharing resource when needed.

All pastoral, elders and other ministry staff are encouraged to attend both events. Details on when and where will be communicated well in advance.

Other events may take place as necessary throughout a year.



### **CLUSTER GROUPS**

Cluster groups meet from once a month to once a term, depending on the location.

Clusters are at the heart of forging good relationships in the region because they are the smallest and most regular of all the gatherings. All Baptist leaders are encouraged to attend a cluster group. These are about sharing what is going on for you in your church context, for you personally and critically to support each other in prayer.

Clusters in our region currently are:

- **Dunedin:** Held 12:30pm-1:30pm second Wednesday of each month at Dunedin City Baptist Church.
- Southland: Held once a term on Tuesdays 1:30-3pm. Location varies between Invercargill and Gore.

### **BAPTIST HANMER RETREAT**

Baptist Hanmer Retreat is held each year in the first or second week of May for two nights and two days in Hanmer Springs.

The retreat is held for specifically pastors and leaders in our Baptist whānau of churches to seek direction, breakthrough and refreshment in the presence of the Holy Spirit. The retreat is optional and open to all Baptist leaders in our whānau.

The Baptist Hanmer Retreat is hosted by the Oxford Baptist Church.

### **BAPTIST LEADERS'** REGISTRATION

Registration is a way for Baptist pastoral leaders,

ecumenical chaplains, and missional leaders to communicate their commitment to professional development.

When you become registered, the Baptist Union and the Carey Centre for Lifelong Learning enter into an agreement with you to recognise and respond to the call God has placed on you. Baptist Hui, Regional Hui, cluster group and Hanmer Retreat can make up part of the Baptist whānau component of Baptist Leaders' Registration.

Registration also enables you to be included on the list of marriage celebrants if you choose.

### **CAREY BAPTIST COLLEGE**

Carey Baptist College is the theological training college serving the Baptist Churches of New Zealand as well as being one of Aotearoa's leading providers of theological education generally. Their calling is to equip Christians to think, lead, and serve in ways that will advance God's mission in this world. They specialise in training people preparing for pastoral and missional leadership (on-site or by distance), but also provide a range of training pathways for anyone wanting to grow in their faith and participate more fully in God's work in renewing this world.

Carey also offer Pastoral Leadership (PL) and Youth Pastoral Leadership (YPL) training. The programme consists of a three year Diploma in Pastoral Leadership (which can also be done on-site or by distance). The PL and YPL tracks provide intentional development of biblical knowledge, spiritual life, self-awareness, leadership skills and preaching. Experienced practictioners work alongside students, mentoring and supervising them through a personalised development track. All of the learning is constantly enhanced by peer group experiences where students support and encourage each other as they grow together in pastoral ministry.

Library membership is available on an annual basis with a discount for Baptist pastors. Many of the 30,000 titles are available as e-books, and hard copy books can be sent around the country.
